Community

The city of Holyoke, located just north of Springfield in scenic Western Massachusetts, is an urban center of 40,000 residents. Holyoke is close to many area colleges, including Amherst, Elms, Hampshire, Mt. Holyoke, Smith and the University of Massachusetts.

School

Holyoke High is a four year public school with an enrollment of approximately 1260 students. The school community represents a wide range of social, cultural and economic backgrounds. The school population is approximately 60% Hispanic, 35% White, 4% Black, and 1% other ethnic groups. Over 80% of the faculty have earned masters degrees or beyond. Holyoke High School is situated off exit 16 of Rt. 91, and close to exit 4 of the Massachusetts Turnpike. The CEEB number is 221018.

Curriculum

Honors weighted classes are offered in grades 10-12 in Accounting, English, Language, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies. Holyoke High School offers AP courses in Calculus, Statistics, Spanish, U.S. History I and II, English III and IV, Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Modern European History.

Grading is based on the following weighted scale:

Class Rank	Class Rank is determined by the weighted GPA over sixteen quarters. Membership in the National Honor Society requires a minimum of 3.5 GPA.
GPA	All graded courses contribute towards the GPA. Fifteen percent of course offerings are at the AP/Honors level. The practical maximum weighted GPA is approximately 4.6.
Graduation	In order to graduate the student must earn a total of 120 credits in grades 9-12. Requirements include four years of English and physical education, three years of math, two years of social studies including U.S. History, and two years of science.
English Language Learners	The E.L.L. program is designed to assist students with acquisition of English as a second language. Courses designated Transitional are taught in English with clarification in the native language, when necessary.
